Contents of the Course

The course imparts the pedagogy of Maria Montessori for 6 to 12 years old children. The foundation course, which is mandatory for students who do not possess an AMI 3 to 6 diploma, gives an overview of the principles of the Montessori materials and theory for the 3 to 6 years old children.

Recognition of the Course

The course is AMI certified. AMI sets the requirements according to which the diploma will be earned by the participant at the end of the course.

Why AMI



The Association Montessori International (AMI) which is based in Amsterdam was established by Maria Montessori in 1929 in order to secure the transmission of the unabbreviated and original Montessori pedagogy. A teacher training that is AMI recognized is subject to strict conditions concerning lecturers,

time tables, curriculum and exams. The Montessori pedagogy has to be implemented true to the principles. Only then can the expected spontaneous work of the children and the positive consequences of this kind of work occur. Also disappointments such as a negative reputation of the Montessori pedagogy can be avoided.

Attributes of the Course

It is important for future work with children that the participants practice the presentations with the original material in a supervised environment.

Observing is one of the most important elements in the Montessori pedagogy. Therefore, the course requirements include observations of children in Montessori classrooms.

Before the future teacher takes the responsibility of guiding a classroom, there must be the opportunity to practice presenting the materials and performing other teacher related activities in a secure teaching environment. The course, therefore, includes practice teaching with children in a real Montessori classroom.

All lectures given in a AMI-Course will be recorded in writing and organized into albums by the participants, which will then be read and assessed by a Montessori pedagogue. The albums will serve as a reference to the teachers throughout their teaching careers. Participants will also make materials for use in the classroom. Lectures will be delivered in English and translated into German or vice versa.

Conditions of Admission

In order to work successfully as a Montessori pedagogue it is necessary to have a sufficient educational background. Recognized as such are the completion of a Kindergarten teacher college, the successful completion of at least half of a teacher training college (an associates degree) or a university degree in pedagogy, psychology or any other subject. Normally, there is a requirement for a state license in teaching to be able to teach at a Montessori school after completing the course. Although this state license is not a requirement for being admitted to the course, we do recommend that participants investigate whether such a license is needed for the respective country of occupation.

Course Location

The course will take place at the Montessori CH International Training Center Switzerland at the Montessori-Schule Luzern, Abendweg 1, 6006 Lucerne.
